The 5th edition of Pariskhas Pe Charcha (PPC-5) 2022 the unique interactive program of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India with students, teachers and parents which will be held through virtual mode in February 2022. In order to select the participants who will be featured in the Pariksha Pe Charcha program 2022, an online creative writing competition is being conducted at MyGov Website on various topics (Annexure-I) from 28th December 2021 to 20th January 2022 for children studying in classes of 9 to 12, teachers and parents. This year the competition is also open to foreign national students as well.

Around 2050 winners will receive a certificate signed by the Director NCERT (National Council of Educational Research and Training) and a special PPC kit of Exam Warriors Book in Hindi or English written by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Pariksha Pe Charcha Competition 2022 is the medium through which we invite the parents and teachers of the students are invited to prepare their questions to be addressed to the Hon'ble Prime Minister. Selected questions shortlisted by NCERT, may feature in the program.

- The Pariksha Pe Charcha competition is open for school students of Classes 9 to 12.
- Students can submit their responses on any one of the Theme (or topics) provided to them.
- Parents and teachers can also participate in online activities specially designed for them and submit their entries.

Themes For Students

- Exam Stress Management Strategies during COVID-19: Creative strategies adopted by you as a student to manage pandemic stress and upcoming exam stress.
- Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav: Do you know the history of the village/town/city where you live? Write about your village, town, or city and share an unknown aspect of the freedom struggle there.
- Self-reliant School for Self-reliant India: What does self-reliance mean to you? Share your thoughts on making you and your teachers "Aatmanirbhar" in terms of teaching and learning when the schools are not fully functional due to the Coronavirus Pandemic (Covid-19).
- Clean India, Green India: Your thoughts on how to strengthen India's fight against climate change.
- Digital collaboration in classrooms: How your teacher made your online classroom fun, interesting and effective during the Coronavirus pandemic. Your thoughts on how the quality of online classes can be improved.
- Environmental Protection and Climate Change Resilience: Activities are undertaken by you as a student during the pandemic period for environmental protection and climate change.
